- **Education reform:** Published eight briefs that were sent to General Assembly members and candidates on topics ranging from early childhood to post-secondary education and used with gubernatorial candidates.
- **Health reform:** Advocated for preserving Medicaid expansion, deepened relationships with key state officials and convened opioid crisis funders affinity group.
- **Federal Policy:** Advocated against weakening of the Johnson Amendment and for full funding of the 2020 U.S. Census.

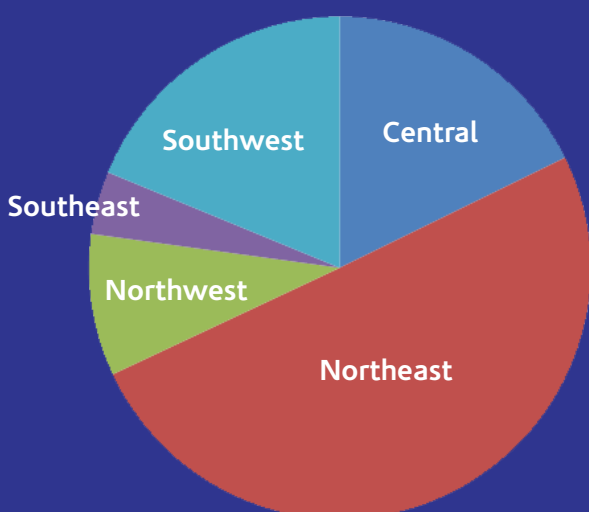

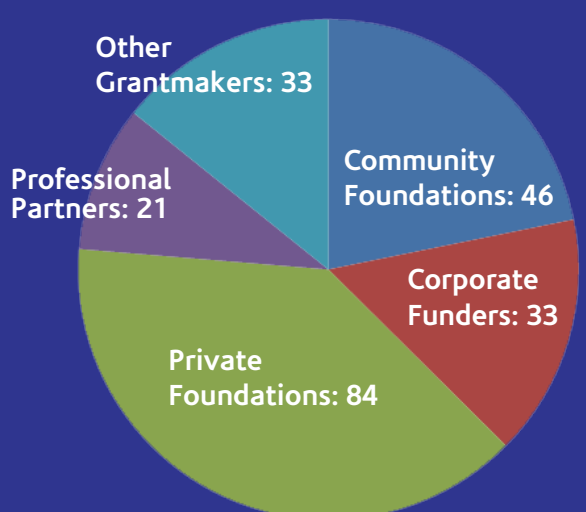
